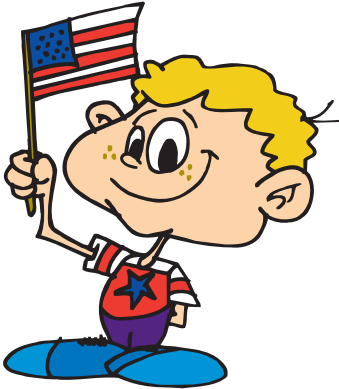

MEMBERSHIP REPORT

As I write this article, I know that the Renewals notices for 2010 are being mailed to the membership. I have the membership cards and as soon as I receive your dues, I will get your card in the mail to you. We would really like to have a large amount of the membership dues for 2010 paid by the 20th of July, so that State Membership Committeeperson Dave Wischer can take them to the Convention being held here in Milwaukee at the Wyndham Convention Center by the Airport. If you are not able to send in your dues prior to Convention, please do so as soon as possible, or please pay them at the Post Picnic or Post Corn Roast. National Headquarters must receive notice from the Post before the middle of August in order to prevent a dues mailing to you in September

National goes out and obtains

services for us that we might not otherwise be entitled to. Take advantage of these discounts.

We ended the 2009 membership year with 321 members. Thank you to everyone who paid his / her membership dues. This was an increase of 23 members for 2009. This also means that we need to reach 321 paid members in order to have 100% membership for 2010. Because we lost several of our members to the "Great Commander" this means that we also need to invite eligible Veterans to join the American Legion. SERVICE OFFICER REPORT

I just wanted to update you about a few bills that are trying to be passed regarding Veterans: Veteran Benefits Improvement Bills in House 3/09 - The House Veterans' Affairs Economic Opportunity Subcommittee, chaired by Rep. Stephanie Herseth Sandlin (D-SD), held a hearing to review 10 bills designed to improve services and benefits for veterans provided by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). "The legislation...covers a wide range of important issues affecting our nation's service members and veterans," said Rep. Herseth Sandlin. The following bills were reviewed:

H.R. 147, To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to allow taxpayers to designate a portion of their income tax payment to provide assistance to homeless veterans. This bill creates a section on the annual tax return form that would allow taxpayers to designate \$3 of their income tax liability to programs that assist homeless veterans without increasing the taxpayers' tax liability.

H.R. 228, To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to establish a scholarship program for students seeking a degree or certificate in the areas of visual impairment and orientation and mobility. Recipients would agree to work as a full-time VA employee for three years after program completion.

H.R. 297, Veteran Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment Subsistence Allowance Improvement Act of 2009. This bill would

provide for an increase in the amount of subsistence allowance payable by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to veterans with service-connected disabilities participating in vocational rehabilitation programs.

H.R. 466, Wounded Veteran Job Security Act. This bill would prohibit discrimination and acts of reprisal against persons who receive treatment for illnesses, injuries, and disabilities incurred in or aggravated by service in the uniformed services.

H.R. 929, To require the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to carry out a program of training to provide eligible veterans with skills relevant to the job market, and for other purposes. This bill would authorize the Military Occupational Specialty Transition (MOST) program, a program designed to help veterans find work and train for good-paying jobs.

H.R. 942, Veterans Self-Employment Act of 2009. This bill would establish a pilot project on the use of VA educational assistance programs to defray training costs associated with the purchase of certain franchise enterprises.

H.R. 950, To increase educational assistance for certain veterans pursuing a program of education offered through distance learning. H.R. 950 would allow veterans taking distance learning courses to receive a housing stipend, under the Post-9/11 G.I. Bill.

H.R. 1088, Mandatory Veteran Specialist Training Act of 2009. This bill would provide for a one-year period for the training of new disabled veterans' outreach program specialists and local veterans' employment representatives by National Veterans' Employment and Training Services Institute.

H.R. 1089, Veterans Employment Rights Realignment Act of 2009. This bill would provide

for the enforcement through the Office of Special Counsel (OSC) of the employment and unemployment rights of veterans and members of the Armed Forces employed by Federal executive agencies, allowing an individual to file a USERRA complaint with the Office of Special Counsel. Currently, servicemembers and veterans are limited to only filing complaints with the Secretary of the VA.

H.R. 1171, Homeless Veterans Reintegration Program Reauthorization Act of 2009. This bill would reauthorize the Homeless Veterans Reintegration Program for fiscal years 2010 through 2014. The program provides grants to community-based providers serving the homeless veteran population. NOTE: This bill was passed by the House on 3/30/09.

These other bills must get through the Economic Opportunity Subcommittee and the full House Committee on Veterans' Affairs before being considered for passage by the House. NAUS encourages you to contact your representative and let him or her know your position on these bills.

POST BLOOD PRESSURE SCREENING Power Program

Our Legion Post's involvement in the POWER program continues! The POWER (POsts Working for VetERans Health) Program is a study which will compare two ways to help people learn how to control their high blood pressure. As part of this study, Gretchen and I are required to give a short presentation at every Legion Meeting - each on a variety of topics.

Considering that we will not have our next Post meeting until September 1st, we will have to present 2 topics in order to remain current with the POWER Program. The topics that will be

presented at the next meeting will be “Calories and Food Labels” & “Preparing for Doctor Visits”. Here’s a brief explanation of the topics to be presented:

CALORIES AND FOOD LABELS

Lots of studies show that the people who are able to count calories are the most successful at losing weight, and avoiding gaining it back. To help us count our calories, Gretchen and I are going to teach you how to read a food label. You will learn about the calories in a serving size ... and the calories you actually eat! We will have handouts to share with your family when you get home after the meeting.

PREPARING FOR DOCTOR VISITS

Gretchen and I learned some tips on making sure you get the most out of visits with your doctor. We will go over these tips and will provide copies of a booklet with lots of advice, and a handy summary. This is an area where all of us know a fair amount already about what works and doesn't work, so come prepared to share your thoughts.

The doctors that work in the POWER Program all agree that the people who get the most out of their visits are the ones that come prepared. You only get 15 or 20 minutes at most visits, so be sure your doctor knows what you want to talk about. It turns out that no matter how smart they are, most doctors can't read minds! You can help by bringing your questions on a piece of paper so you don't forget them. And remember your blood pressure card!

You have probably noticed that even though the POWER Program is focused on high blood pressure, most of the things we talk about are useful for people with many chronic conditions, or for people who are fine now and want to stay that way. So come prepared to

learn, even if you don't have high blood pressure!

I look forward to seeing you at the next meeting. Enjoy the Summer break!

REQUESTS FOR FUNDS FROM THE CHILDREN, YOUTH AND VETERANS FUND

We have very strict guidelines on the request for funds. All requests must be in writing and given to the Fund Raising Committee for discussion. The Committee will recommend approval or disapproval and determine the amount of funds to be dispensed. The Committee will then take the requests to the Post Executive Board for approval or disapproval. If approved by the Board, the request will then be brought before the Membership for discussion and approval. AT NO TIME, will funds be dispersed from the Fund from the Membership Floor, or by verbal request. If funds are requested at a Membership Meeting, the request will be taken to the Committee at the earliest possible date, discussed, taken with recommendations to the Executive Board, and then back to the membership. These guidelines were put into place to prevent motions from the floor, for monies, without knowing where the monies are coming from. Anyone who wants to request funds must follow these procedures. 
