MEMBERSHIP REPORT

We officially ended our membership year with 293 members. Sadly, for many different reasons, many of our Legion members did not renew their dues this year. Some of this was due to death, some to the economy, and several members moved, and we have not been able to locate them. However, because of the Legion membership rules, we will still be required to have 321 members for 100% for 2011. Dues notices will be arriving in your mailbox shortly. Please renew as soon as possible. It is very costly for the Legion to mail out notices several times during the year, so the sooner I receive your dues, and send them to the State, the sooner, the mail notices stop coming to your mailbox. Please note, that the notices go out at specific times from National, and if I did not get your dues in time to send them to State, you will get a notice even if you are paid. You can renew your dues online. Similar to notices from subscriptions for magazines.

Regular Dues are \$35.00. Dues for

members who are retired and have ten (10) or more years in the Post are \$28.00. Your renewal notice will not reflect the \$28.00 for retired persons. Please contact me, if you have questions about dues.

This is also a good time to ask an eligible Veteran to join the American Legion. If they ask what the Legion can do for them, please tell them to visit our website. The Legion does not sit idle. We are dedicated to helping Veterans, Children, Youth, the Community, State and Nation.

The Legion always fights hard on both the State and National Levels. It takes a lot of time and effort to ensure that our Veterans benefits continue for health care and education. Many of the Veterans bills that are presented to Congress come from the American Legion. The Legion fought hard to preserve our health benefits with the Veterans Administration, and health benefits for retired military, and disabled military and their families when the Congress and Senate were working on the National Health Care Bill.

The American Legion to DoD: Nonaction Medal is 'Nonstarter'

INDIANAPOLIS, May 14 /PRNewswire - US Newswire/ — Calling a proposal to award U.S. troops medals for holding fire in a war zone “misguided,” the head of the nation’s largest veterans organization voiced concern that overly restrictive rules of engagement would ultimately cost lives.

“Nobody likes to see innocent civilians killed in a war zone but the blame for these tragedies lies with the terrorists who caused the war in the first place,” American Legion National Commander Clarence E. Hill said. “The proposal

to award medals for holding fire is troubling because it is symptomatic of a growing culture in the military that will punish troops for making split-second decisions while they are expected to defend themselves and their comrades. This proposal is an insult to our men and women in combat who already do an extraordinary job of exercising restraint. Too much restraint will get our own people killed.”

Hill also worried that rewarding those who don’t use force sends the wrong message to those that do. “Vietnam veterans were outrageously slandered as ‘babykillers,’” he said. “This was tragic because the overwhelming majority of those who served there tried to prevent innocent casualties. Now, by awarding those who supposedly practice restraint, we would be implying that our heroes who have to fire their weapons are somehow failing in their mission or coming up short. It’s a bad idea and the Pentagon should kill it.”

With a current membership of 2.5 million wartime veterans, The American Legion was founded in 1919 on the four pillars of a strong national security, veterans affairs, Americanism, and youth programs. Legionnaires work for the betterment of their communities through more than 14,000 posts across the nation.

HOW TO SHOW RESPECT FOR OUR AMERICAN FLAG

One of the things that we have noticed at the Post are members saluting the flag wearing baseball caps or hats "other than Legion Caps". Respect for the flag states that a Veteran may salute the flag without a hat or cap. The only proper cap to wear is the Legion / VFW / Military / or Veterans Organization caps. Baseball hats, cowboy hats, or other headwear MUST be removed before saluting the American Flag. Please be respectful.

Veterans between 55 and 65 Did you graduate from High School?

April 30, 2010

An Act to amend 120.13 (37) (a) 1. of the statutes; relating to: granting high school diplomas to certain veterans with service-connected disabilities.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau Under current law, a school board may award a high school diploma to a person who attended high school in that school district or attended high school in the state and resides in the school district if the person is 65 years or older, left high school to join the U.S. armed forces during a war, and served on active duty under honorable conditions.

This bill authorizes a school board to award a high school diploma to a person who is 55 years or older if that person has a service-connected disability and, with the exception of age, meets the above conditions.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows: SECTION 1. 120.13 (37) (a) 1. of the statutes is amended to read: 120.13 (37) (a) 1. Is at least 65 years old, or is at least 55 years old and has a service-connected disability. This was signed by Governor Doyle on 4/21/2010.

Please take this article with you to the School so that they have the information to process. Some of the Districts have not updated their records.
