Stress Study Says Force 'Under Strain'

While more intense combat in Afghanistan in 2010 led to an overall dip in morale, military medical officials say that the latest joint mental health survey of combat Soldiers and Marines shows that troops fighting in Afghanistan are doing better than expected.

"Our teams were struck by the fact that they didn't see as much increase in mental health (issues) as expected based on the significant increase in combat exposure," said Col. Paul Bliese, team leader of Joint Mental Health Advisory Team 7 survey and director of the psychiatry and neuroscience division at Walter Reed Army Institute of Research.

Comparing results to past surveys the surveyed troops "did not appear to be having as much of a negative reaction to combat stress" as they'd expected, Bliese said.

Mental health surveys have been conducted in both Afghanistan and Iraq since 2005. The surveys are overseen by the Army's Office of the Surgeon General with support from the surgeons general of the Navy and Air Force and the Medical Officer of the Marine Corps.

The purpose is to assess the behavioral health of combat forces, look at the efficacy of delivering mental health care needs in theater and make recommendations for any improvements.

The latest survey was conducted in Afghanistan during July and August 2010 with

Soldiers and Marines in randomly selected combat units. The troops completed the surveys anonymously.

The survey states that the behavioral health picture among combat troops in Afghanistan in 2010 is complex -- there's no specific theme to describe troops' behavioral health status, it says.

But, the report states, it is "noteworthy that ratings of acute stress are higher in 2010 than in any other year except 2007 (a year with a small sample size), and that ratings of individual morale have significantly declined since 2009. The behavioral health status results indicate a force under strain." Analyses of the recent data shows dramatic increase in levels of combat -- significantly higher than levels in previous years, according to the report. And because the sampling among Soldiers was identical from 2009 to 2010, the results are very conclusive in showing that actual combat has intensified within the past year.

"The rates of exposure to key combat experiences reported in 2010 are not only elevated in terms of previous years of OEF (Afghanistan), but they are also elevated in terms of Soldiers' experiences in Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF)," the report states.

For instance, the 2006 survey found that nearly 60 % of Soldier respondents reported experiencing a member of their unit becoming a casualty. That figure was the highest reported rate collected in OIF, but is well below the over 70 % rate for Soldiers surveyed in Afghanistan for 2010. There is also a dramatic increase in the percentage of Soldiers who reported being "directly responsible" for killing an enemy combatant. In the 2006 survey, 15 % of surveyed Soldiers said they killed an enemy; last year the percentage was just over 48 %.

The combat exposure of Marines was also higher, even compared to intense combat in Iraq in 2006. There, 50 % of leathernecks experienced losing a buddy in combat; for Marines surveyed in Afghanistan last year, the number was 79 %.

The survey's findings show that, among Army Soldiers, acute stress rates are significantly higher

than they were in 2009 and 2005. Rates of combined psychological problem measure -- acute stress, depression or anxiety -- are also significantly higher than 2005, according to the report.

Not surprisingly, the survey revealed more Soldiers on follow-on deployments than in 2009.

"Soldiers on their third (or) fourth deployment report significantly more psychological problems and use of mental health medications than Soldiers on their first or second deployment," it states.

Among Marines, officials said, unit morale dipped from about 23 % calling it high or very high in 2006 to about 11 % last year. It said individual morale was not as significantly changed, though the report shows it dipped from about 28 % of those calling it high or very high to about 21 %.

As with the Soldiers surveyed, the percentage of Marines reporting psychological problems such as acute stress symptoms, depression or anxiety, is significantly higher in 2010 than in 2006 or 2007.

The evaluation team saw increases in acute stress symptoms and decreases in morale, Bliese said, "but our perception was that we would have expected a much larger increase in mental health symptoms and a much larger decrease (in morale) based on the incredibly high rates of combat exposure."
